

STREETS MAINTENANCE WORKER II

DEFINITION

Under general supervision, to perform a variety of semi-skilled, skilled, and physical labor duties in the maintenance, repair, construction, and clean-up of City streets, street trees, sidewalks, curbs and gutters, parking lots, driveway approaches, traffic signals, and street lights; and to do related work as required. Serves as Disaster Service Worker. FLSA Status: Non-exempt. Bargaining Group: Miscellaneous Unit.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

This is the experienced journey level classification in the Streets Maintenance Worker class series. The Streets Maintenance Worker II level is distinguished from Streets Maintenance Worker I by performing a broader range of semi-skilled, skilled, and more complex responsibilities in the maintenance, operations, and repair work on a more independent basis. Incumbents in this class are subject to twenty-four hour "call out" and standby.

REPORTS TO

Public Works Superintendent, Streets and Parks Division Supervisor, Streets Maintenance Worker III, or as assigned.

CLASSIFICATIONS SUPERVISED

This is not a supervisory position.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Performs the installation, maintenance, and repair work to City streets, street trees, sidewalks, curbs, gutters, parking lots, driveway approaches, traffic signals, street lights, and street trees; participates in the preparation of streets for paving asphalt and concrete repair; breaks and removes concrete and asphaltic concrete; saw cuts concrete; posts traffic signs, and routes traffic around work sites; installs traffic cones and barricades as needed; ensures compliance with health and safety regulations, applicable laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations including traffic diversion; performs asphalt patching, repaving chuck hole, and crack sealing repairs; installs, constructs, and/or repairs concrete sidewalks, curbs, and gutters; installs or repairs rails; cuts, fits, lays, repairs, cleans, and flushes storm water maintenance pipes; cleans fittings on lines and fire hydrants; clears brush and debris from storm drains; cleans road spills including hazardous materials according to established City and departmental guidelines; performs street striping as assigned; operates spray guns and brushes to paint pedestrian crosswalks, bus stops, parking and center lines, and other pavement markings according to applicable City ordinances and laws; mixes paint to proper consistency; cleans spray

equipment; stencils letters for curb and street pavement legends; assists in the lay out and measurement of parking zones and traffic markings; removes and erects street signs; installs or repairs guard rails; estimates material and supply needs for projects; does general clean-up work; uses general hand tools; operates and maintains heavy and light power-driven street maintenance and construction equipment such as trucks, back-hoe, front loaders, tractors, skip loaders, rollers, jackhammers, paint rigs, crack sealers, thermos, grinders, concrete saws, graders, and related equipment; performs street sweeper duties as needed; performs preventive maintenance on equipment; performs miscellaneous minor repair and maintenance on automotive equipment and small engines; maintains a variety of records related to inspections, maintenance, and repairs; communicates with the public; may be assigned to assist with other departments or divisions for maintenance and repairs as needed; may be required to attend night or weekend events; and performs other duties as assigned.

TYPICAL PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Frequently stand and walk; walk for long distances and on sloped ground and slippery and uneven surfaces; normal manual dexterity and eye-hand coordination; ability to lift material weighing over 100 lbs. with assistance; ability to bend, stoop, kneel, crawl, and crouch; corrected hearing and vision to normal range; verbal and written communication; use a variety of hand and power equipment used in street maintenance and construction.

TYPICAL WORKING CONDITIONS

Work is performed outside in varying temperature, weather, and humidity conditions; work is performed in an environment with constant noise; exposure to gasses, fumes, dust, grease, and oils; exposure to moving equipment; exposure to electrical current; constant contact with staff and the public.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of:

- Safe driving practices and the California Vehicle Code relating to the operation of motor vehicles.
- Work safety practices.
- Methods, procedures, and equipment used in the construction and maintenance of City streets, street trees, sidewalks, curbs and gutters, parking lots, driveway approaches, traffic signal lights, and street lights.
- Characteristics, uses, and preparation of paving techniques and skills involved in pouring and finishing concrete.
- Tools, equipment, and materials used in streets maintenance and repair work.
- Operations and maintenance of a variety of heavy and light power-driven street maintenance and construction equipment including motor sweepers, rollers, tractors, backhoes, skip loaders, jackhammers, and related equipment.
- Laws, rules, and ordinances pertaining to traffic signs and markings and vehicle and equipment operations.

- Proper methods of mixing paints to appropriate consistency.
- Safe and proper layout of traffic striping.
- Blueprint reading techniques.
- Health and safety regulations.
- Excavation techniques to ensure safety of gas, telephone, power, TV, water, and sewer lines.

Ability to:

- Perform a variety of semi-skilled, skilled, and physical labor work in the installation, maintenance, and repair of City streets, street trees, sidewalks, curbs and gutters, parking lots, driveway approaches, traffic signal lights, and street lights.
- Perform heavy physical labor.
- Understand and follow oral and written directions.
- Maintain and make basic repairs to equipment.
- Maintain basic records.
- Safely operate hand and power tools and equipment related to the maintenance and repair of streets, street trees, sidewalks, curbs and gutters, parking lots, driveway approaches, traffic signal lights, and street lights.
- Ensure compliance with health and safety regulations, applicable laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations including traffic diversion.
- Operate and maintain heavy and light power-driven street maintenance and construction equipment such as trucks, backhoe, and front loaders.
- Engage in legal and defensive driving practices.
- Load equipment on trailers for transport.
- Erect and work from platforms, scaffolding, and ladders.
- Estimate material and supply needs for projects.
- Deal tactfully and courteously with the public.
- Establish and maintain cooperative working relationships.
- Follow Department operations, policies, and regulations.

Training and Experience:

- Two (2) years of increasingly responsible work experience in operations, monitoring, testing, maintenance, repair, and construction work comparable to Streets Maintenance Worker I with the City of Atwater; or
- One (1) year of increasingly responsible work experience as a Streets Maintenance Worker I with the City of Atwater.

Education:

- Equivalent to graduation from high school.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- Possession of valid first aid and CPR certification.
- Possession of, or ability to obtain, appropriate certifications or licenses as designated by the City of Atwater.

License:

- Possession of a valid California Commercial Class “B” driver’s license with appropriate endorsements.

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
